

## Statement of Practice Use of Institutional Funds for Gifts in Memory or Gifts in Honor

Sonoran University Employees may use institutional funds to express condolences or congratulations to their team members who experience a personal tragedy (such as the death of a family member) or personal milestone (such as a wedding, the birth of a child, etc.) via planting trees in memory or celebration through the Arbor Day Foundation.

Planting trees is \$2 per tree with a 10 tree (\$20) minimum donation.

The decision to support an employee via this method is delegated to the department level and should not exceed \$20 per instance.

Additional details and exceptions

- Included in this practice are Sonoran trustees, advisory council(s), donors, and alumni (to be coordinated by the Development Department or Alumni Relations Department respectively).
- Departments may purchase a plaque to honor an employee who retires in good standing from Sonoran after a minimum of 5 years of service.
- If a department wishes to get flowers, make a donation, or engage in another activity in honor or memory of a team member, individuals may elect to gather funds for other types of acknowledgement.
- This practice applies to students only in the case of death of a student while attending Sonoran.
- This practice does not extend to using institutional funds for celebration of, or condolences to, Sonoran students.
- Celebration or condolence cards may be sent by any employee to any Sonoran constituent.
- In the case of a current Sonoran employee passing, the institution may consider additional or alternate ways to memorialize the individual.
