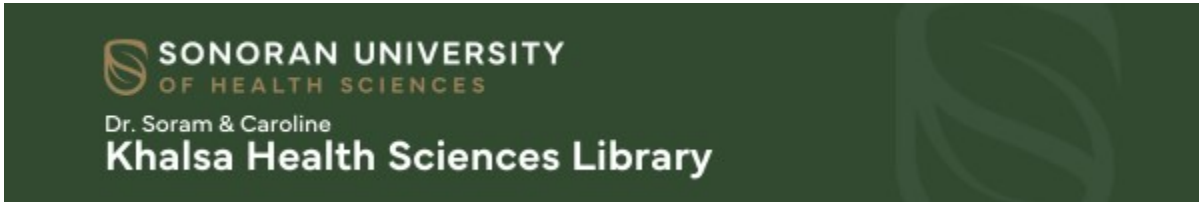

RECOMMENDED BROWSER

It is likely you have a preferred Internet Browser that you utilize daily. However, it is important to be aware that not all web browsers are created the same. And these differences can be significant in how they affect the functionality and appearance of websites. As a result, you may experience issues when accessing the Library's databases and other online resources depending on which Browser you regularly use. If you are having problems accessing the Library's databases and resources, you may wish to explore using a different Browser. The Library has found, and recommends, **Google Chrome** to be the most consistent overall in successfully utilizing the many various Library databases and online resources. Though not always the most popular, please consider using this particular Browser for the Sonoran Library resources.

Meanwhile, on occasion, you may still experience issues with accessing your Library account and databases. Some troubleshooting tips that the Library recommends can be related to any of your Browsers and their settings. Remember to regularly clear the Cache in your Browser. Regularly rebooting, closing and reopening, your Browser can also be significant. Additionally, sometimes you will need to turn on your Pop-Up feature. And sometimes, making sure your Browser is current can be a factor. Be sure that your computer is regularly successfully updating, and often just rebooting your computer completely can make a big difference.

Please consider and make sure to try all of these troubleshooting tips before contacting the Library about account and database access issues.



LWW Health Library

The **LWW Health Library** is a subscription-based resource, produced by the Wolters Kluwer / Lippincott Williams & Wilkins publishing company, that features leading medical content, plus multimedia, self-assessment, algorithms, case studies, and more. Of course, here at Sonoran University, it is most popular for the wealth of Ebooks content. To be clear, understand that only a select few medical books published strictly by the LWW publishing company will be found in this particular Database.

On the Library's MySonoran site, you will find the link to the LWW Health Library first in the "A-Z List of Library Resources" on the "Library Resources Databases Holdings" page. Be sure to click on it to link out to the Library LWW account page. It will take you right to the LWW Library of Medical Textbooks, many of which are required and/or recommended for your Basic Sciences, CLPR and various other Sonoran University Courses.

PICO : PERFORMING AN EFFECTIVE LITERATURE SEARCH

The actual search for high quality clinical research evidence can be overwhelming to many. By utilizing the PICO format, the search process will be streamlined and will yield the best available evidence to support clinical decisions and explore alternative treatments and procedures. - **Define your topic or question**
 - As much as possible, clearly define your question
 - Consider utilizing PICO for medical questions –
 - P – Patient/Population or Problem
 - I – Intervention (often treatment, diagnostic test, or procedure)
 - C – Comparison (Is there a control group or another intervention to consider?)
 - O – Outcome

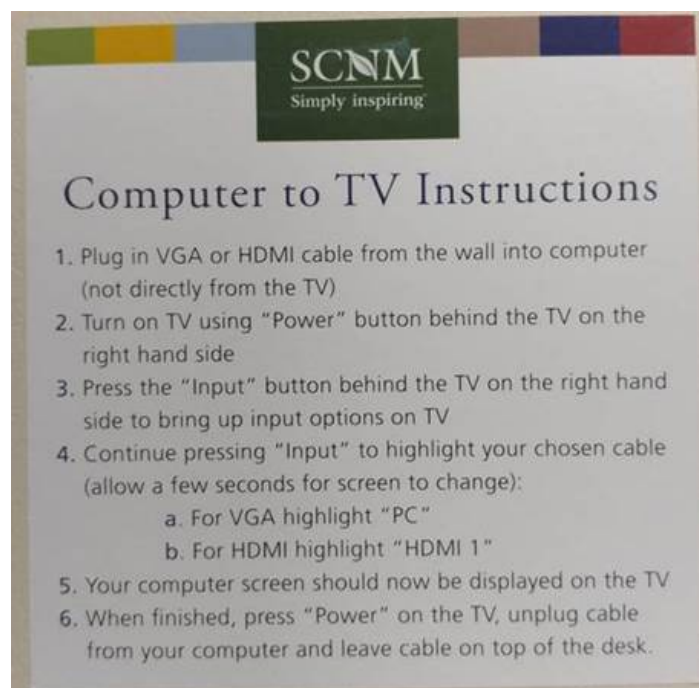
Journal articles can be a big part of the research and papers you do at Sonoran University. One of the Journals Databases that the Library subscribes to is Alt-Healthwatch. This is a full-text alternative health research database focused on complementary, holistic and integrated approaches to health care and wellness, including botanical medicine, nutrition, homeopathy and more. If you need just a few, quick to obtain, articles for your research project, Alt-Health Watch will usually suffice. It is widely used by many American libraries. This indexing and retrieval service provides a broad but selective sampling of articles, all full-text, from 180 alternative, integrative and naturopathic medical, and nutrition, journals, as well as workshops, conferences, etc., featuring all kinds of alternative therapies and modalities. Unlike other services, it usually includes full text retrieval. Some items in this database are consumer-oriented rather than scholarly; but when beginning a search, it is possible to limit it to only scholarly, peer-reviewed journal articles. Many public libraries, community college libraries and hospital libraries may have this alternative medicine database in their resources.
