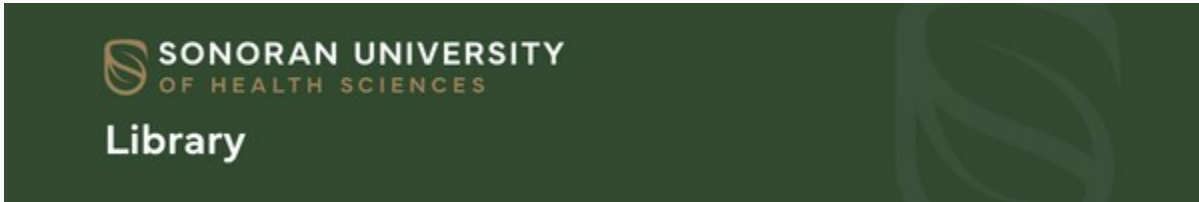

[Clinical Pharmacology](#) is a point-of-care database consisting of drug information, drug interactions, IV compatibility, patient education, and more. It is accessible off campus with your library account access. Or, if you wish, you can register to create your unique account profile for off campus use. You can try this while off campus, but it might be you must be on campus, connected to the Sonoran University wi-fi, to create this account, and you must register with your Sonoran email.

OLD BOOKS IN THE PUBLIC DOMAIN

There are many, many resources (books, writings, etc.) that are available as Open Access materials with no restrictions on downloading, copying, printing and usage. In other words, Copyright is not an issue. Among these are thousands of books originally published prior to 1924 that are in the Public Domain due to Copyright Expiration. Now, you might be thinking that in 21st Century medical school, there couldn't possibly be any need for books that were published 100 plus years ago. Mostly, in the Basic Sciences, you are probably right. While many of these historical writings are great for a foundational understanding, in a number of the unique areas of Nutrition and Naturopathic Medicine, there are many such books that are in fact just as relevant today as they were 100 years ago.

One of the best examples is in Homeopathy, where books and writings by Hahnemann, Kent, Herring, etc., published in the 1800s are still significant today. In Botanical Medicine are the writings of Nicholas Culpeper, John Milton Scudder and Harvey Wilkes Felter, and the early Hydrotherapy writings of Vincenz Priessnitz and Sebastian Kneipp are also now available Free Full Text, no strings attached.

There are many Non-Profit organizations and institutions (in America and around the world) that have developed sites for digitizing these (and many many many other) early writings in all fields of academia, etc. Some examples include Project Gutenberg, HathiTrust, and several major Universities and public libraries.

What makes this truly exciting is that you can download these great books in any format you want, onto as many devices you want. They become yours for access whenever and wherever you like. While the most common, this digitization is not strictly limited to PDF. On some sites, these historic books can also be found in unique electronic book reader formats such as Daisy, Torrent for Mac, EPub for iPad, Kindle, and many more.

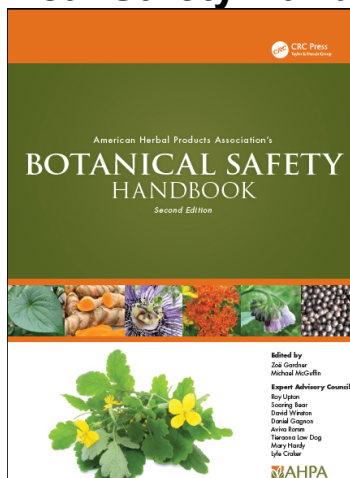
Your searches may yield many modern publications not openly accessible. Use the GoogleBooks Tools menu to filter your results to strictly Free Google eBooks.

This publication is an essential tool for anyone who manufactures, recommends, or uses herbal products. It provides safety information on over 500 species of herbs, derived from data compiled from clinical trials, pharmacological and toxicological studies, medical case reports, and historical texts. It was co-edited by Zoë Gardner, research and development manager at Traditional Medicinals (the book's Research Editor) and AHPA President Michael McGuffin (the Managing Editor). In addition, all entries were reviewed by an Expert Advisory Council that includes some of the most renowned herbal and integrative medicine experts in the United States.
